^{3/} For information only. The Class I and II prices for the Texas order would have been 12.95 and 10.09, respectively, for January 2000. Also, the Class I and II prices for the New Mexico - West Texas order would have been 12.14 and 10.09, respectively, for January 2000. The January 2000 Class I price and Class II skim milk price for the Southwest order will be issued Dec. 23, 1999. However, should a legal challenge delay implementation of the consolidation and reform of the Federal milk order program as required by the Omnibus Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2000, then the Class I & II prices in the first sentence of this footnote will be applicable.

^{4/} The processor assessment is an obligation under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order (7 CFR § 1160.101 et seq.). The Order requires that all persons who process and market more than 500,000 pounds of fluid milk products in consumer-type packages in the contiguous 48 States of the continental United States and the District of Columbia be assessed 20 cents per hundredweight on all marketing of such packaged fluid milk products during the month.

^{5/} The Class I price for the New Mexico-West Texas Marketing Area is the basic formula price for the second preceding month plus \$2.35, subject to the zone adjustment for that location.
